- House Captain/House Assistant: Duties included directing/training usher staff, writing performance reports, handling and documenting patron complaints, coordinating performance start times with backstage staff, overseeing late-seating, facilitating special events, and enforcing Performing Arts Center policy.
- Head Usher: Duties required managing usher staff, greeting patrons, assisting House Captain with front-of-house matters, completing event back charges, and enforcing Performing Arts Center policy.

- Usher: Duties included greeting/seating patrons, setup of lobby/special events, ticket-taking, handling seating conflicts, and enforcing Performing Arts Center Policy.
